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

ABOUT THE FESTIVAL



Welcome to the sixth successive edition of Lyra - Bristol Poetry Festival, taking place from 12th - 21st April 2024, at ten venues. This year's festival theme, *Poetic Futures*, explores, through the lens of poetry and words, not only technology and the future, but also the imaginative power of language in shaping and reimagining new worlds. This year's headline poets include Alice Oswald, Raymond Antrobus, Safiya Kamaria Kinshasa, Nikita Gill, Simon Armitage, Salena Godden and many more of the most exciting names in contemporary poetry, including three winners of the most recent Forward Prize for Poetry.

We're delighted to be exhibiting technologically ambitious technologically ambitious installations, including the Bonds audiovisual poetry exhibition at Bristol Beacon, the Cancer Alley poetry film hologram exhibition at Watershed, and Deanna Rodger's Poetic Fortune Teller. There will be a panel and performance on Al and poetry (part of Lyra's new Page Against the Machine project), an Al and poetry writing workshop, a poetry and technology film screening, and other expansive, genre-pushing activities. Poetic Futures will be explored through a Queer Futures event, a workshop and Joelle Taylor's new show *The Night* Alphabet, a multimedia Hot Poets talk on poetry, climate and saving the world, and activities which contrast the past and future, such as our *Caribbean Nights* film screening, poetry and archives workshop, a Beyond Poetry panel discussion, and historical walking tours. On the centenary of American writer James Baldwin, a workshop led by US writer Danez Smith and panel led by Bristol-based Edson Burton will reflect on his legacy and Baldwinian futures. Our closing event, City of Words, will be a celebration of Bristol, with its many perspectives and histories, and a collaboration with the inimitable Bristol Ideas, as part of their closing activity. Many community groups commissioned by Lyra in 2024 will also showcase their work.

We're thrilled to welcome four poets from Ghana for an exclusive performance at Lyra this year, including acclaimed poet Gabriel Awuah Mainoo. A huge welcome to our friends who are travelling all this way to Bristol and curating Back Stories of the Afro Wind, an evening of West and East African poetry. Thank you to Bath Spa University for funding this exciting cultural exchange.

This year we have more live streamed events than ever before, so you can watch along at home or even take part in a workshop, if you're unable to attend in person. We also have numerous BSL interpreted events across the two festival weekends. There are more than ten free activities in this year's 30+-strong programme. Specific information about accessibility across our various venues can be found on our website homepage, which will also take you to an access form, if you'd like to let us know in advance about anything we can help you with.

Our 2024 Festival Poet is shakara. who will be running a workshop and performing new work at the festival, as well as taking part in a discussion panel and running community outreach activities across March and April. shakara is a Jamaican-born artist who embodies a fusion of technology and creativity, weaving together poetry, spoken word and filmmaking with Al. They seamlessly blend their academic background with their creative practice, incorporating coding and Al-inspired creations. shakara is intrigued by Al's potential to uplift global majority voices and is dedicated to centering the narratives of black queer women. They will be exploring the intersection of art and technology, paving the way for technologies rooted in humanbased ethics.


POETRY FILM HOLOGRAM EXHIBITION

Cancer Alley is an immersive poetry film hologram which features environmental destruction in 'Cancer Alley', Louisiana, the heart of the global petrochemical industry. The project draws attention to the need for multinational companies to take more responsibility for their impact on the environment and to growing public awareness of how people's lives are affected by extreme pollution. Cancer Alley is free, and is available to view, on a continuous loop, at Watershed 17th-21st April.

Cancer Alley has been created by poet Lucy English, US filmmakers Pamela Falkenberg and Jack Cochran, and Bristol-based company Holotronica.



Back in the 1980s, the UK had little idea of the wealth of poetry coming from the Caribbean. In 1986, the BBC's thought-provoking Arena film *Caribbean Nights: Poetry* changed all that. Featuring Trinidadian intellectual Darcus Howe chairing an illuminating discussion with St Lucian poet Derek Walcott (1992 Nobel Prize for Literature), pioneering British-Jamaican reggae poet Linton Kwesi Johnson and emerging British-Guyanese poet Fred D'Aguiar, it also includes clips of, among others, the electrifying Jamaican dub poet Michael Smith and innovative Barbadian Kamau Brathwaite, who championed using Caribbean English in poetry.

Come and watch *Caribbean Nights: Poetry*, which, even now, feels fresh in its insights. Afterwards, poet and editor Rishi Dastidar, 2023 TS Eliot Prize winner Anthony Joseph and Louisa Adjoa Parker will talk to noted Bristol academic Madhu Krishnan about the vital need for diverse poetry in our everyday lives, before Helen Thomas reads a new poem inspired by the film.

Alice Oswald has published six collections of poetry, including *Dart* (2002), which won the TS Eliot Prize. She is the first female Professor of Poetry at Oxford and has a particular interest in poetry as an oral tradition.

Rachel Long's debut collection, My Darling from the Lions (2020), was published by Picador and shortlisted for numerous prizes, including The Costa Book Award, The Sunday Times Young Writer of the Year Award, The Rathbones Folio Prize and the Jhalak Prize Book of the Year.

Caroline Bird's selected poems *Rookie* (2022) and *The Air Year* (2020) are two of Carcanet's most popular books of the present decade. She won the Forward Prize for Best Collection in 2020 and has been shortlisted for a number of prizes, including the TS Eliot Prize, the Costa Book Awards, the Ted Hughes Award, the Polari Prize and the Dylan Thomas Prize.







One of the finest poets and writers today, Jackie Kay's long-awaited new collection, *May Day*, casts an eye over several decades of political activism, from the international solidarity of the Glasgow of Kay's childhood, accompanying her parents' Socialist campaigns, through the feminist, LGBT+ and anti-racist movements of the 80s and 90s, up to the present day, when a global pandemic intersects with the urgency of Black Lives Matter.

Kay brings to life a cast of influential figures, delving beneath the surfaces of received narratives: the Jamaican model Fanny Eaton, for example, muse of the Pre-Raphaelite Brotherhood in England; Paul Robeson, Angela Davis and the poet Audre Lorde; and a 'what-if' poem concerning Rabbie Burns and a road-not-taken towards the West Indian slave trade. Woven through the collection is a suite of lyric poems concerning the recent losses of Kay's parents: poems of grief and profound change that are infused with the light of love and celebration.

Kay will read from her new work and discuss this with Bristol Ideas' director, Andrew Kelly.
